



### Rationale

Accurate and comprehensive reporting of school and student performance aids in establishing open communication helps to improve student learning, assists in establishing future direction, and helps to identify areas of exemplary performance, as well as those in need of support and assistance.

### Aims

- Schools are responsible for reporting on student achievement to the standards themselves, to parents, other teachers and schools, the Department of Education and training (DET) and to the school council through the annual report. This will be done in accordance with the Privacy Act regulations
- Each year our school will provide parents with two written reports on student achievement, indicating progress against
